On the 12th day of January, the following, among other proceedings, were had by the County Commission of Bollinger County:

The Bollinger County Commission met today pursuant to adjournment of January 5th, 2026 with the following officers and members: Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, Chad Hulvey and Travis Benfield, Associate Commissioners, Megan Jo Hill, County Clerk. Meeting called to order by Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, at 8:00 a.m.

Commission reviewed minutes from January 5th, 2026 commission meetings. Leo Arnzen made a motion to approve minutes as read, second by Chad Hulvey. A vote was taken results are as follows: Leo Arnzen yes, Chad Hulvey yes, Travis Benfield yes, all were in favor, motion carried.

Daniel Winningham from the Banner Press observed.

Jason Barber with Fischer Rock Quarry introduced himself to the commissioners and discussed the price increases for Fischer Quarry and offer Bollinger County a \$0.75 discount per ton.

Representative Steve Jordan met with the commissioners before his drive to Jefferson City. The Commission and County Clerk gave Representative Steve Jordan all engineer reports, letters of the current situation with the Courthouse, Financial/Budget reports. Rep. Steve Jordan will be meeting with budget officials in Jefferson City to look into funding for the county for new courthouse since Bollinger County is limited and do not want to put more burden on the citizens.

No bids were sent in for the 524 bridge.

Brad Gregg, R&B supervisor, met with the commissioners to discuss the road maintenance and bridges within Bollinger County. He also discussed the uniforms for R&B Employees. R&B workers will receive 5 short sleeve shirts, 5 long sleeve or hoodies, 1 Coat or hoodie, and 200 per year pants allowance that will be reimbursed by receipt only. Switching this will save the County roughly \$5,000.00 or more.

Misty Stevens and Captain Jackie Wilson spoke to commission about dispatch

Kevin Cooper, Emergency Management, spoke to commission about FEMA funding.

Megan Hill, County Clerk, and Loretta Overbey spoke to commissioners about current residents in Zalma and the complaints that have be received within the office. Kevin Cooper, Emergency Management, will be reaching out to state to resolve some of these issues.
