On the 25th day of August, the following, among other proceedings, were had by the County Commission of Bollinger County:

The Bollinger County Commission met today pursuant to adjournment of August 18th, 2025 with the following officers and members, Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, Chad Hulvey and Travis Benfield, Associate Commissioner, Megan Hill, County Clerk. Meeting called to order by Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, at 8:00 a.m.

Robert Spurlock met with commission in regard to TransAmerica Corridor to give a presentation on the project. In attendance with this meeting was several Bollinger County residents (Exhibit A Attached). Mr Spurlock spoke about how beneficial the I-66 Corridor would be for businesses and new businesses that would move the area. Currently there is no board formed and the “projected” layout is not set in stone and will not be till the 10 million study is performed. Barry Hovis said he was for the project, Senator Jamie Burger was for the project, Steve Jordan was for the project, and Tony Harbison was currently against the project. Kyle and Laura Booth spoke out against the project. The commissioners want MoDot to fix the current roads instead of focusing on the I-66.

Nonie Cowell, Collector, met with commission to have the Commission accept or reject the Senior Service Tax applications submitted. She currently has 845 accepted applications.
