On the 15th day of June the following, among other proceedings, were had by the County Commission of Bollinger County.

The Bollinger County Commission met today pursuant to adjournment of June 8th, 2026 with the following officers and members: Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, Travis Benfield and Chad Hulvey, Associate Commissioners, Megan Jo Hill, County Clerk. Meeting called to order by Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, at 8:00 a.m.

Commission reviewed minutes from June 8th, 2026 commission meeting. Leo Arnzen made a motion to approve minutes as read, second by Chad Hulvey. A vote was taken results are as follows: Leo Arnzen yes, Chad Hulvey, yes; Travis Benfield, yes; all were in favor, motion carried.

Brad Gregg, R&B supervisor, to discuss road maintenance and bridge maintenance. R&B has fixed BCR 320 installing a culvert pipe, BCR 872 with beaver dams. They are working on BCR 322 & 720 today. Still working on BCR 878, 208, 628. BCR 718, 719, 716 needs to be mowed. Spoke to commissioners about the best way to place the end county road signage and discuss that he would like to start installing a foot. Commissioners agreed. Travis Benfield says yes and Leo Arnzen says yes to the purchase.

Commissioners listen to voicemails:

- BCR 352 there is a top of a tree dangling close to the road and the road is pretty rough.
- BCR 878 needs chat on the road.
- BCR 310 needs the street sign needs back up.
- Construction company has called about the Scopus Solar project.

Megan Hill, County Clerk, spoke to commissioners about the workers' compensation procedure for the county and about the Road & Bridge hiring a tire company to handle all tire repairs.

Daniel Winningham observed the meeting briefly.

Kevin Cooper, Emergency Management, met with commissioners today to update FEMA funds.

Melissa Finley, Public Administrator, met with the commissioners to update about county wards and attached is the report.

Nonie Cowell, Collector, spoke to the commissioners about moving the mailbox over to the new building.

Sheriff Stash Petton and Captain Jackie Wilson met with commissioners to discuss the approval of new deputy vehicles for road usage and also the vehicles that will no longer be in use by the sheriff's office. Sheriff also spoke about the Bollinger County employee policy rewriting to fit the sheriff's office.

Subject: Update on County Ward Status

I wanted to submit an update to the Commission as to the number of wards currently being served by the Public Administrator's Office.

- Just in review the Court can issue orders of Guardianship or Conservatorship.
- The current numbers include 50 total orders.
- Guardianship letters total 25 and Conservatorship letters total 25.
- Guardianship only includes 5 people.
- Conservatorship only letters total 6 people.
- 20 wards are both Guardianship and Conservatorship.
- The total number of people being served is 31.
- I have also been asked by the court to serve as trustee in a case involving two incapacitated individuals who currently reside in Southern California (I did not include this on the numbers submitted).

- Funds held for County Wards
 - Checking accounts and special needs trust accounts: \$359,700 (approximate)
 - Investment accounts (CD): \$232,340
 - Restricted investment account: \$523,648
 - Restricted Irrevocable trust account: \$20,000
