On the 9th day of February, the following, among other proceedings, were had by the County Commission of Bollinger County:

The Bollinger County Commission met today pursuant to adjournment of February 2nd, 2026 with the following officers and members: Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, Chad Hulvey and Travis Benfield, Associate Commissioners, Megan Jo Hill, County Clerk Meeting called to order by Leo Arnzen, Presiding Commissioner, at 8:00 a.m.

Roland LeSiere met with the commission to ask the county to submit funds per month to help with sewer problems. Chad Hulvey said no. Glen Allen options at this point is to speak to a lawyer about dissolving .

Eva Dunn met with the commissioners to discuss the Library budget and to present the budget with the commissioners.

Micah Bristow met with the commissioners to discuss Stephen Gray, Prosecuting Attorney and the injustice he has done to his daughter. His daughter sat in jail then was released to be home with an ankle monitor and lost her job because of Stephen Gray continuing pressing charges when it was later discovered that she was innocent of the charges. He would like Stephen Gray to not be Prosecuting Attorney.

Jr Davis met with commissioners about T's House and receiving money from the Opioid Funds for housing and electric. He brought paid receipts to be reimbursed by the Opioid Funds. Commissioners at

this point in time have not decided whether to approve these. They will speak to the attorney for a clearer answer and to determine use of the Opioid Funds.

Kevin Cooper met with commissioners to discuss Opioid Funds since he and previous Sheriff Casey Graham applied for these funds. He also updated the commissioners on what he has been doing for the county.

Sheriff Stash Petton and Captain Jackie Wilson met with the commissioners to give a sheriff/jail update. They also mention that ICE has contacted the Sheriff wanting to work more with local law enforcement. Captain Jackie Wilson let the commissioners know that the AT&T 911 line is currently down and not working. But with the new system they have, they can see when someone is placing a 911 call and call them back from a working number.

Treasurer Scott Minson gave the weekly bills for the commissioners to approve.

Treasurer Scott Minson also spoke to the commissioners about possibly offering a reduced stipend to the employees who use health care not provided to county employees. This is a benefit offered to County Employees and the Employees that do not take it and use other health care are not receiving this benefit. He mentions other Counties do this and the State of Missouri also does this for their employees. After much decision with other elected officials and the commissioners, it was decided to place this on the back burner till next year when the county can look more into and discuss legal concerns.
